# INTRODUCTION TO WHISKY

All single malt whisky is made from 3 very simple ingredients. Water, malted barley and yeast. But although the ingredients may be the same, the taste of each distillery has its own unique character. This unique character is down to a variety of factors. These factors include the length of fermentation, the size and style of the stills and also the operational procedures. Such as the amount of spirit saved which they call the 'cut'.

Another key factor contributing to the unique character of the spirit is the water found in Scotland. The water is very soft because there is no limestone. The water flows over hillsides overgrown with heath and through peat meadows. This gives each single malt a unique flavour specific to its distillery.

The process starts with letting the barley germinate within a huge drum or a 'Saladin box' until the starch of the grain has become malt sugar. The malted barley is then dried and coarsely ground. Hot water is then added to convert the soluble starch into a sugary liquid called 'wort'. The solid remains are used for what we know as cattle pellets as the nutrients from the barley are perfect for a cow's diet.

The 'wort' is then cooled and held in a huge tank holding anything from 9,000 to 45,000 litres of liquid. This is where it begins to ferment with the addition of yeast. This can take about 48 hours and produces a liquid known as 'wash', which begins to contain low strength alcohol.

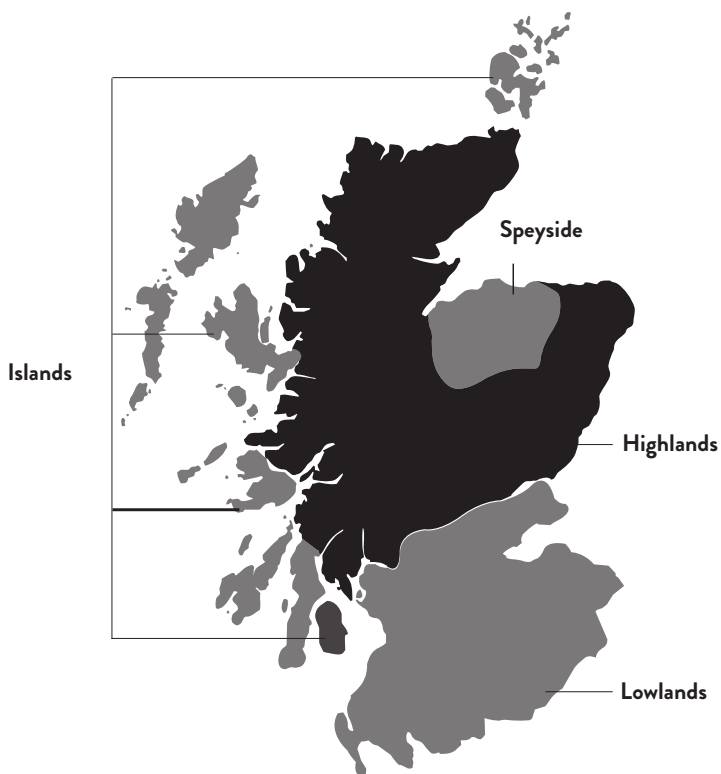
This is when the liquid is ready for distillation in large copper pot stills, which heat the liquid until the alcohol becomes a vapour. This rises up the still and is passed into the cooling plant, where it is submerged in very cold river water, where it condenses back into a liquid state. This first distillation separates the alcohol from the fermented liquid and is known as low wines. At this stage, it is distilled for the second time and collected in a Spirit Receiver where it is then checked by a qualified person, trusted to ensure the purest form of the spirit has been produced.

This leads us to the final stage where it is matured for a minimum of 3 years in casks from Europe, all the way to America in different woods. This stage influences the colour and taste due to the flavour of the cask being infused into the spirit.

The area from which the single malt comes from is a key element in the overall flavour of the whisky. There are 5 main areas of whisky production in Scotland. Islands, Highlands, Speyside, Lowlands and Islay.

Currently there are around 90 operational malt whisky distilleries in Scotland.

Historically in Scotland whisky was known as 'Uisce beatha', Gaelic for 'water of life'. Considered to have medicinal properties, it was also used as a drink of welcome and farewell. So come down to our lounge bar and revive a tradition that is over 2000 years in the making.
